### **WEB Source Format:**

Editor, author, or compiler name (if available). "Article Name." Name of Site. Name of organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher). Date of last update. Medium of publication. Date you visited the website. << URL website address>>.

(Be careful! The site name is not the same as the article name and not the same as the organization name! If something is not available, you must show that it is not available using abbreviations: n.d.=no date; n.a.=no author, etc. You may not use "Wiki" sites, "Ask" sites, personal blogs, personal websites, historical novels, personal interviews, or movies ,although certain educational documentaries may be ok)

- Historical novels (fictional stories set in a historical context)
- Movies (although educational documentaries may be used, if preapproved by your teacher)
- Personal interviews (interviews with documented experts directly in the field of study may be used, if preapproved)
- Your Scottsdale Preparatory Academy Science textbook (although you may use other science textbooks)
